Digital Wellbeing Project comes to an end

In 2020 we were approached by the Tameside and Glossop Integrated Care NHS Foundation Trust to set up a digital literacy project which sought to address the health and wellbeing of our community through improving digital inclusion. This project ran from the spring of 2020 until May of this year.





The project had a challenging start as the Covid pandemic prevented face to face engagement with clients. Once restrictions were lifted, digital support was provided initially in clients' homes and then through eight digital training groups in the community.

In total 85 Digital Champions were trained to help clients. Their dedication cannot be underestimated, providing bespoke one-to-one support for the many clients that came along to our Digital Training Groups.

In summary, the project received 392 referrals through 41 referral partners, delivered 1887 hours of digital skills training and provided 197 devices.
